



HOLDENS DO IT AGAIN!

Tony Roberts and Peter Haas of Engineering Department, Fishermen's Bend have been declared provisional winners of the 1966 BP Rally of South Eastern Australia. A field of 37 entries took part in the event, and included teams like Firth/Denham, Lumm/Thomas (last year's winners), and all major competitive makes of motor vehicles were represented. Half of the trial was in New South Wales and the first part of the Rally was contested in heavy rain.

All in all, it was a hectic trial and to their credit, Tony and Peter lost only 68 points right throughout the trial.

Last year's winners, also driving a Holden, finished fourth in the event.

This is the second success for Tony and Peter as a team. They won the Caltex Begonia Rally, which is the first event of the Victorian State Trials Championship.





Ace racing driver and GMH dealer Greg Cusack recently wrote 16 new records into the Australian record book.

The successful record bid was made in an HR Holden sedan on the tough Sandown Park motor racing circuit.

In 24 hours of non-stop driving, finishing at 11.20 a.m. Cusack and his Castrol racing team-mate Bruce Burr covered a total of 1519.78 miles at an average speed of 63.32 m.p.h.

The run was made to test a new motor oil under the operating extremes of non-stop high-speed driving.

The records set are in Class D, 2nd Category Sports and Touring Cars. Subject to ratification they are:—

Cusack, a GMH dealer in the A.C.T., is the current holder of the Australian Formula 2 championship.

The previous year he held both the Formula 2 and Australian 1½ litre championships.
